

EXPLORE

The award winning National Anzac Centre overlooks the harbour from which over 41,000 men and women departed Australia for the Great War. Immerse yourself in the Anzac legend and follow personal stories through state of the art technology, multimedia and historic artefacts.

DISCOVER

Wander the grounds of the Princess Royal Fortress and experience what it was like to protect Australia's shores at times of war. Explore original gun batteries, large coastal gun defences and the barracks where officers lived and worked.

COMMEMORATE

The Desert Mounted Corps Memorial stands at the summit of Mt Clarence. It is a recast of the original statue erected at Suez in 1932. The granite blocks are the originals from Suez and bullet marks can still be seen on them. It was unveiled by Sir Robert Menzies, Prime Minister of Australia on 11 October 1964.

REFLECT

Take in stunning views of King George Sound, Princess Royal Harbour and the city centre of Albany.

REMEMBER

The Albany Avenue of Honour was originally planted in Middleton Road in 1921 to remember those who perished in World War I.

GROW

The Avenue of Honour on Mt Clarence was planted in 1955-1956 and replaced the original one planted in 1921 in Middleton Road. It honours those who died in service or were killed in action in World War I, World War II, and also the Korean and Vietnam Wars.

CONTEMPLATE

A Salute to Anzac mural is a dedication to all those men and women who have served in the Australian armed forces in all theatres of war and peacekeeping operations, and all future servicemen and women.

CONNECT

The Anzac Peace Park is designed as a landscape of peace. It is an iconic location connecting city and harbour, endowed with multiple symbolic associations. The Lone Pine Grove in Albany provides a major focus for the theme of peace within Anzac Peace Park. It expresses a direct and living connection between Gallipoli and Albany and the idea of peace across time, place and people.

DEPARTURE

The curved Pier of Remembrance extending into Princess Royal Harbour provides a site for contemplation where we might reflect upon lives lost in war and reimagine the first troopships departing in 1914.

RELEASE

Overlooking the channel bearing his name, the scenic boardwalk that leads from Albany to Middleton Beach is home to a life-sized statue of Mustafa Kemal Atatürk, Commander in Chief of the Turkish forces at Gallipoli, and subsequently President of Turkey from 1923 - 1938.
